

## Prospects Diploma

Meaningful Employer Engagement



All students are tasked with sourcing and participating in the equivalent to one week's **MEE** (otherwise known as work experience) before the start of their second year. This will allow them to undertake and evidence experience of work in an area relevant to their career aspirations or, if they are undecided on their career goal, a placement that will support them in exploring their progression options. Students are fully supported on the Prospects Diploma and all expectations are outlined in the third Prospects Diploma session. MEE can take many forms:



A work experience placement spread over a period of time equivalent to at least one full working week, in a role either relevant to their career aspiration or, if undecided, that will support their progression/employability skills. This can be undertaken during the College day, during periods that they are not already committed.



A volunteering placement in a role either relevant to their career aspiration or, if undecided, that will support their progression/employability skills, spread over a period of time equivalent to at least one full working week. This can be undertaken during the College day, during periods that they are not already committed.

A week long block placement in a role either relevant to their career aspiration or, if undecided, that will support their progression/employability skills. This can be undertaken outside of term time (during reading weeks, Easter or the summer holidays).



Participating in more than one College organised employer-led project. These take place throughout the year and are advertised via curriculum areas and the College News. Students must be able to evidence their participation, and associated feedback from the employer, to be able to include this as part of their employer engagement.

Students have access to an online tool to create their own professional profile to record and track all activity related to the Diploma. They are set three Awards as part of the Diploma: Bronze, Silver and Gold, and are given full guidance on the tasks required and how to log their evidence on their profile.
