Face Coverings

Teaching Spaces and Communal Areas:

Staff, pupils and visitors will not be required to wear a face covering but it is recommended you continue to wear one in crowded and indoor spaces where you may come into contact with people you do not normally meet.

Testing

All staff and students are now **NOT** required to take Lateral Flow Tests

Visitors/Contractors

Will not need to take a LFT prior to attending the college

If not feeling well, visitors are advised not to attend the college and follow the NHS advice

Self Isolation

Staff and students will not need to self isolate if they suspect they have contracted COVID

It is recommended that if staff/students contact COVID, they stay at home until feeling better before returning to the college
