This year, 27 students celebrated receiving an offer of a place at either Oxford or Cambridge. We are hugely proud of our students, 13 of whom will be enrolling at Cambridge and 14 at Oxford in September. They will be going onto study a variety of degrees, from Law to Engineering, Medicine to Mathematics. The College has an enviable track record of students progressing onto prestigious universities. In September 2018, 31% of our second year A level leavers who progressed on to higher education were studying at a Russell Group University, the 24 leading UK universities dedicated to outstanding teaching, learning and research. This is a tremendous reflection of the high quality of teaching and learning at the College.



Sporting success at the AoC National Championships 2019

Twenty of our students recently travelled to the University of Nottingham where they battled against athletes from colleges across England, Wales and Northern Ireland during a three day event - the Association of Colleges National Championships. This year students competed in golf, cross country, badminton, tennis and basketball.

Ryan Golesworthy won a bronze medal with the South East tennis team, whilst **Izzy Lawson** picked up bronze in golf.

The South East men's cross country team, including Farnborough students **Aaron Enser and Ethan Kendall** secured team silver whilst the women's team, made up of **Emily Jones, Emily Spencer-Jones and Emmie Savory**, took victory with gold.

The badminton team, consisting of **Nick Pipe, Sophie Mercure, Mattie Tennant-Smith, Finn Saunders and Callum Mitchell,** won the silver medal for the second consecutive year.

Our women's basketball team dominated the championships and won the title, bringing home the gold medal. The team included Fredrica Hempson, Triana Peart, Carmela Manalo, Bivika Balal, Olivia Treacy, Jescintha Subbiah and Emily Brent.

Overall, our students came home with 20 medals and helped the South East region to finish in 1st place!
