WELCOME

The start of the academic year has gone as smoothly as I could have hoped, considering the exceptional circumstances we are all facing. The staff and I were very pleased to be able to open the College on 7 September and start teaching again. There have obviously been a number of changes to the College site with one way systems to get used to and wearing face coverings in communal areas as well as three hour lessons. The teachers have been brilliant at managing the three hour lessons and are making excellent use of the technology that we have to make lessons accessible and interesting.



I have spent some time walking around the College and speaking to students about their experiences so far. Without exception, the responses to my

questions have been overwhelmingly positive and there is an obvious desire from the students to get back to studying. Many of them say they prefer the three hour lessons as they can get so much done in the extended time.

I am also pleased to say that all of the students I have spoken with said that they had made friends in their classes. This is an unintended consequence of having seating plans, as all the students are mixed up and are therefore not sitting with friends from their previous school. I am very happy and proud of the way that the students have adapted to this new way of learning.

We have recently held our very first virtual Open Days which were hosted on the College website. Due to the current restrictions on holding large events, we have transformed the website which now includes lots of new video content and information about being a student at Farnborough.

We are also in the process of arranging our first ever virtual Awards Evening, where we celebrate those students who left us in the summer and present special awards. More details about this event will be published on the website shortly.

Finally, I urge all parents/guardians to sign up to the <u>Parent Portal</u> if you haven't yet done so; this platform is a way of keeping communication channels open. This is particularly important at the moment, as we will be using the Parent Portal to communicate with you about your child's progress. I also ask that you check the College <u>website</u> regularly as we are continually reviewing our provision in the light of COVID-19 and are using the website as the primary method of updating you at short notice. You should have also received an email from me recently regarding assessment, cancelled lessons and contingency plans.

NOTICES

Lifts to and from College and car parking - We ask that parents/guardians who are dropping or picking up their child to/from the College do so away from the site and car parks. Please do not block any resident driveways or entrances. We also strongly encourage students not to park in any residential streets around the College without a pass. We ask for your cooperation with this to help ease the congestion on the roads around the College.

Absences from College - If students are unable to attend College, we must be notified in one of the following ways:

- call Main Reception (ideally before 10:30am) on 01252 688200;
- send an email to studentabsence@farnborough.ac.uk; or
- via the Parent Portal.

Second year students can record absences on CristalWeb as long as their attendance is above 90%. A reason must be given for their absence and contact is required for each day that college is missed. Whilst it is polite for students to contact their teachers to let them know, this is not compulsory and will not authorise the absence. Absences that are not notified are monitored carefully and we will contact parents/guardians if this occurs.

Lanyards - Students must wear their lanyard at all times whilst they are on the College site.

Photo Consent - We love to use pictures of our current students to show what life at Farnborough is like, including for website news stories, social media, advertising and the prospectus! The law requires written consent to use these photos. We ask that students set their preferences on CristalWeb. Students can update these preferences at any time by clicking their name in the top right hand corner of CristalWeb and selecting 'Consent Options'.
