

### **YOUR STUDIES**

Everyone who studies at Farnborough has an individually tailored timetable. Before you choose your courses, it is important to understand your options. Your GCSE grades will give you a good indication of your likely future level of study. Your Personal Tutor will advise at interview and again at enrolment once you know your GCSE results.

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#### A levels

These are general academic courses mainly assessed through examination at the end of two years.

#### Vocational (Level 3)

These are equivalent to A level but are more vocationally oriented and predominantly assessed through coursework.

#### **EPO**

Stand out from the crowd - the EPQ is an independent research qualification, valued by universities, equivalent to half an A level.

## How many subjects do you need to study?

Our standard expectation is that students will study the equivalent of three subjects, though four subjects is possible for some of the most able students.

#### Meaningful Employer Engagement

Everyone is expected to undertake meaningful employer engagement in addition to their chosen subjects. We have a specialist employability team who will support you - see our 'Be Work Ready' section.



## THE VOCATIONAL PATHWAY

The College offers a vocational pathway for students who do not currently meet the entry requirements to study level 3 qualifications.

This provides a practical, real-world approach to learning which will include a meaningful and relevant work placement. You will review your own performance regularly and assessment is 100% through coursework, taking away the pressure of examinations. This pathway is valued for progression into further study, employment and apprenticeships. STEP

# BUSTING COLLEGE MYTHS

THE MYTH: You have large class sizes.

**THE TRUTH:** Our class sizes are between 18 and 19, ideal for study at this level.

THE MYTH: The College is too big for me.

**THE TRUTH:** It's true that this is a big college HOWEVER you will be part of a smaller tutorial group and will quickly get to know other students studying the same subjects as you – remember all of you will be new to the College.

THE MYTH: I won't know anybody.

**THE TRUTH:** For those who join as the only student from your current school, we have special getting to know you events so you can meet people in the same situation.

THE MYTH: Farnborough is A level focused.

**THE TRUTH:** We offer a range of vocational courses which are predominantly assessed through coursework and valued both for HE and employment. You can study these as a way of accessing A levels in the future too!

THE MYTH: Farnborough has high entry requirements.

**THE TRUTH:** There is no overall points score required to come to Farnborough and we will work with you to agree the courses you study. Some courses do require you to have certain GCSE grades, and this is because we want to give you the best chance of success. #### A UK perspective

Our students go on to study at the most prestigious universities across the UK and increasingly beyond. Feedback from these students confirms that Farnborough provided them with the best possible grounding for university life including preparation for self-directed. independent learning.

#### How are we adding value at Farnborough?

Value Added is a measurement used by the Department for Education to analyse a student's progress from their achievements at GCSE to their final A level grades.

In 2016/17 the DfE published national tables which showed that A level students at the College, sitting exams in the summer of 2016, made the most progress from their GCSE starting points than students in any other college in Hampshire or neighbouring Berkshire and Surrev.

## **SUPPORT FOR YOU**



At Farnborough, every student matters: both in and out of the classroom, we take supporting you very seriously.

#### **Personal Tutors**

Our team of Personal Tutors are chosen through a careful selection process to ensure they are the right people to guide and support you at every step of your journey through College. Weekly tutorials will cover everything from investigating your future career options and HE applications, to developing vital life skills. Simply put, your Tutor will be your rock during your time at Farnborough, listening, challenging and supporting you to achieve your very best.

#### **Study Support**

We are committed to responding flexibly and effectively to students with special educational needs whenever practicable. Our team will work with you to identify and address individual learning needs, arranging appropriate support sessions or technical support.

#### Counselling

During your time at College, you may find that you need some additional help. We provide a free and confidential counselling service which is open to all students. Last year the College was awarded the AcSEED Award which recognises those who adopt best practices to support the emotional wellbeing of students. We are the only Sixth Form College to have achieved this award.

#### **Financial Assistance**

In 2016, the 'top performing' A level institution in the country (according to The Sunday Times, 19 August 2016) had a total A level cohort of 133 students who achieved 99% A\*-B grades in 3 or more A levels. By comparison, in the same year, 100% of our top 540 students achieved A\*-B grades. Nor is this unusual for Farnborough; a similar pattern of success can be seen since the last century!

### Meaningful Engagement with Employers



The Prospects team, which has links to both local and global employers across a range of employment sectors, will help you identify suitable work placement possibilities. Having experience of working really will give you the edge and for some of our courses it is compulsory.

### **M**oodle

At Farnborough we are pioneers in the use of **Kloodle**: an online platform where you can build your CV, recording every aspect of your learning and experience. This might include work experience, employability skills, volunteering, enrichment activities and academic achievement. The great thing about your Kloodle profile is that it's portable and you can add to it throughout your career.





## **VOLUNTEERING**

The College competes in football, rugby, netball, hockey, badminton and basketball at county, regional and national levels.

There are also opportunities to represent the College in swimming and cross country.

Highlights from the last year include:

## **MUSIC**

Described as 'a story of astonishing achievement' by BBC Radio 3, our music department is one of the largest and highest-profile in the country, providing outstanding musical tuition for hundreds of students.

Over 30 concerts are organised each year, from grand choral projects to intimate recitals. Students have performed in some of Europe's foremost venues, including St Paul's Cathedral, Winchester Cathedral, St Mark's Basilica, Venice and the Nikolaikirche, Leipzig and enjoy unparalleled industry experience, such as performing, recording and editing at the famous Abbey Road Studios.

We have collaborated with world renowned artists such as Julian Lloyd Webber, Joanna MacGregor, Angela Hewitt and Alina Ibragimova who have led inspirational masterclasses and recitals for our students.

Students have access to world-class facilities, including a purpose-built recording studio, 300 seat Theatre, recital room, 3 grand pianos (including a Bösendorfer), 12 fully-equipped practice rooms and 20 MacBook Pro computers.

Future plans include tours to North America, Poland and France, a fully-staged operatic production and a concerto competition at the Royal Academy of Music.

We are also delighted to be able to offer music scholarships, which provide sponsorship for advanced musical training and extraordinary performance opportunities. Awarded in partnership with the Royal Academy of Music, our music scholarships are highly competitive and coveted awards.

Scholars are chosen for their especially outstanding musicianship and performance skills and they occupy a unique position within a vibrant department full of talented students. 
## YOUR JOURNEY TO FARNBOROUGH




**Getting here by train** – There are three stations within easy walking distance of the College: Farnborough Main, Farnborough North and Frimley. Please see the map below for routes.






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
