YOUR STUDIES

Everyone who studies at Farnborough has an individually tailored timetable. Before choosing your courses, it is important to understand your options. GCSE grades will give a good indication of your likely future level of study. Your Personal Tutor will advise at interview and again at enrolment once you know your GCSE results.

A levels

These are general academic courses mainly assessed through examination at the end of two years.

Vocational (Level 3)

These are equivalent to A level but are more vocationally oriented. Assessment varies per course and can be either all coursework or a combination of coursework and examination.

EPQ

THE VOCATIONAL PATHWAY

The College offers a vocational pathway for students who do not currently meet the entry requirements to study level 3 qualifications.

This provides a practical, real-world approach to learning which will include a relevant work placement. You will review your own performance regularly and the majority of assessment is through coursework, taking away the pressure of examinations. This pathway is valued for progression into further study, employment and apprenticeships.

THE MYTH: You have large class sizes.

THE TRUTH: Our class sizes are on average between 18 and 19, ideal for study at this level.

THE MYTH: Farnborough has high entry requirements.

THE TRUTH: There is no overall points score required to come to Farnborough and we will work with you to agree the courses you study. Some courses do require you to have certain GCSE grades, and this is because we want to give you the best chance of success.

OUR RESULTS

In 2017, our students achieved an astonishing pass rate of 99.2% at A level. Almost a third of these were awarded at either A* or A and nearly 85% of courses were graded at A* - C.

The picture of success is similar for the vocational courses we offer, with a pass rate of 100% in 13 out of 14 subjects. For the students taking our Introductory Diploma in Health and Social Care, a staggering 100% achieved the highest grade of Distinction*. At Level 2, students who resat GCSE maths with us made greater improvement on their grades than at any other college in Hampshire (with over 100 students) and this progress was the 5th highest nationally!

Aiming High

For those students with future ambitions to study at the most competitive universities, we offer many opportunities to help you achieve your goal. Our success speaks for itself: typically, around a third of our students who apply to Oxbridge receive an offer - significantly above the national average (20%).

In 2017, the 'top performing' A level institution in the country (according to The Times, 26 August 2017) had a total A level cohort of 157 students who achieved 98.6% A*-B grades in 3 or more A levels. By comparison, in the same year, our top 582 students all achieved A*-B grades. This is not unusual for Farnborough; a similar pattern of success can be seen since the last century!

Careers Advice

We have a dedicated team of professional careers advisers who are here to help you make informed choices about your future. This team has been awarded the Quality in Careers Standard, a national award which recognises our commitment to provide impartial, independent careers education, information, advice and guidance.

There are two major careers exhibitions held at College each year: the Training, Employment and Apprenticeship Fair and Moving On Day. Both provide extraordinary opportunities to speak directly to hundreds of universities, employers, training providers and global corporate businesses to help you better understand your options.

Meaningful Engagement with Employers

The knowledge and understanding you will develop through undertaking relevant work experience is a vital part of your education. Whether you carry on in education or enter the world of work, it is highly likely that you will be asked about your essential workplace skills – skills such as resilience, effective communication and problem solving.

The Prospects team, which has links to both local and global employers across a range of employment sectors, will help you identify suitable work placement possibilities. Having experience of working really will give you the edge and for some of our courses it is a requirement.



The Prospects Diploma

The Prospects Diploma is a compulsory, evidence-based programme, designed in collaboration with several employers, training providers and HE institutions. The programme raises awareness of employability and enables students to accurately evidence their personal skills and achievement profile ready for progression into the workplace, either directly or via university/further training.

Created in line with many of the compulsory elements of our Tutorial and Employability Programmes, the Award has received positive feedback from 95% of leavers, who felt that the College "had significantly contributed to their employability".

MUSIC

Described as 'a story of astonishing achievement' by BBC Radio 3, our music department is one of the most renowned and versatile in the country, providing outstanding musical tuition for hundreds of students.

Over 30 concerts are organised each year, from grand choral projects to intimate recitals. Students have performed in some of Europe's foremost venues, including St Paul's Cathedral, Winchester Cathedral, St Mark's Basilica, Venice and

the Nikolaikirche, Leipzig, and enjoy unparalleled industry experience, such as performing, recording and mixing at the world-famous

Abbev Road Studios.

In addition, students have opportunities to collaborate with world renowned artists, with past masterclasses and recitals being delivered by musicians such as Julian Lloyd Webber, Joanna MacGregor, Angela Hewitt and Alina Ibragimova. Future plans include tours to North America, Poland and France, a concerto competition at the Royal Academy of Music and Choral Evensong at Westminster Abbey.

The department boasts world-class facilities, including a purpose-built recording studio, 60 brand new iMac computers running Logic Pro X and NI Komplete 11, 300 seat Theatre, recital room, 4 grand pianos (including a Bösendorfer), 12 fully-equipped practice rooms, 3 bespoke contemporary music rehearsal spaces and 20 MacBook Pro computers.

We are also delighted to be able to offer music scholarships which provide sponsorship for advanced musical training and extraordinary performance opportunities. Awarded in partnership with the Royal Academy of Music, our music scholarships are highly competitive and unique within the sector.

Scholars are chosen for their especially outstanding musicianship and performance skills and they occupy a unique position within a vibrant department full of talented students.


YOUR JOURNEY TO FARNBOROUGH




Getting here by train – There are three stations within easy walking distance of the College: Farnborough Main, Farnborough North and Frimley. Please see the map below for routes.
