CHOOSING YOUR COURSES

Everyone who studies at Farnborough has an individually tailored timetable. Before choosing your courses, it is important to understand your options. GCSE grades will give a good indication of your likely level of future study. Your Personal Tutor will give advice at interview and again at enrolment once you know your GCSE results.

You will see from the 'Courses' pages on the College website that subjects have different entry requirements, which are set to give you the best chance of success.

All students are required to have GCSE English language and maths with at least a grade 4. If you do not achieve these grades, you can resit the exams at Farnborough.

Firstly, an explanation about what the options for study are:

LEVEL 2 COURSES

These are courses for those students who need to resit GCSE English language and/or maths. See more information about the 'Vocational Pathway' which is equivalent to Key Stage 4.

LEVEL 3 COURSES?

These are courses, both vocational and A level, which are equivalent to Key Stage 5. In order to access these courses, you must have at least a grade 4 in English language and maths as well as other required grades which are detailed on our website.

A levels These are general academic courses mainly assessed through examination at the end of

Vocational These are qualifications that are equivalent to A levels but are more vocationally oriented. Assessment varies by course and can either be all coursework or a combination of coursework and examination.

A levels and vocational courses are not mutually exclusive and can be studied together. For example, you psychology.

EXTENDED PROJECT QUALIFICATION (EPQ)

Stand out from the crowd - the EPQ is an independent research qualification, valued by universities and equivalent to half an A level. This is started in the summer term of your first year. You will be given more information about this closer to the time.

In addition to your chosen courses, your timetable will also include Tutorial and Prospects Diploma sessions, as well as any enrichment groups you participate in.



VOCATIONAL PATHWAY

The College offers a vocational pathway for students who do not currently meet the entry requirements to study level 3 courses.

This provides a practical, real-world approach to learning which will include a relevant work placement. You will review your own performance regularly and the majority of assessment is through coursework, taking away the pressure of exams. This pathway is valued for progression into further study, employment and apprenticeships.

QUESTION: Do you have large class sizes?

Our class sizes are on average between 18 and 19, ideal for study at this level.

QUESTION: Is the College too big for me?

ANSWER: It's true that this is a big college. HOWEVER you will be part of a small tutorial group and will quickly get to know other students studying the same subjects as you – remember all of you will be new to the College. Some courses do require you to have certain GCSE grades, and this is because we want to give you the best chance of success. 2018 - ANOTHER BRILLIANT YEAR

Our students achieved an astonishing pass rate of 99.1% at A level. Almost a third of these were awarded at either A* or A and 82.3% of courses were graded at A* to C.

The picture of success is similar for the vocational courses we offer. In 2018, 96.6% of students on vocational courses were awarded the top grades of Distinction/Distinction* - an amazing achievement.

For the students taking our Introductory Diploma in health and social care, a staggering 67 out of 70 students achieved the highest grade of Distinction*. Our Certificate in music (performance) students also achieved fantastic results, with 19 out of 22 gaining a Distinction*.

Students who have to retake GCSE English language and maths also achieve exceptional results with us. The progress score, which compares our students' results to the actual achievements of other students with similar prior results, shows that students achieve far better results at Farnborough than they would have done at an average institution.

Our scores of 0.60 in English and 0.84 in maths mean nearly half of our GCSE English students achieve a grade higher with us, and in GCSE maths almost all of our students gain a full grade higher!

DEGREE **CLASSIFICATION**

The education landscape is changing and it is clear that HE is far from being the only option available to you. However, HE is still the most popular choice and more of our students achieve first/ upper second class degrees than those students who attended all other types of schools (state or privately funded) and other sixth form colleges.

Whilst our results are impressive, you need to take a deeper look to really understand how well all of the students who choose Farnborough do in their studies.

VALUE ADDED

Value Added (VA) is a measurement used to analyse a student's progress from their achievement at GCSE to their final grades.

The VA figures show that 1017 out of 4421 A levels were graded one grade higher when taken at the College than if they had been taken at a college or school sixth form achieving the national average. For vocational qualifications, this figure is 91 out of 378.

Another way of looking at this is to say that students in average colleges who are working at the top of a grade would have achieved the next grade higher at Farnborough - for example, a student in another college working at a B+, would have achieved an A if they had come to us.



For vocational subjects, this would mean a student in another college working at a high Distinction would have achieved a Distinction* if they had studied at Farnborough.

Simply put, students who choose Farnborough for their studies achieve better results than those who attend any other colleges in Hampshire, Berkshire or Surrey.

Compared with schools and colleges across the country, our A level students achieved results that put them in the top 10% and our vocational students achieved results that put them in the top 1% - an outstanding achievement!

TEACHING EXCELLENCE

The mission of the College is to be a distinguished provider of the highest quality education and we commit to this by ensuring we employ the best teachers, whose passion is to improve students' achievements. Staff go above and beyond to support students throughout their time here and this is reflected in the results and positive feedback we receive in student surveys. A number of teachers have been nominated by former students for the University of Oxford's Inspirational Teachers Award.

Staff often contribute to academic journals and articles, and have published books relating to their fields of expertise. Many of our teaching staff are also examiners, meaning they are experts in exam technique. They also have a deeper understanding of the standards required for assessments, with many contributing to and writing exam board books.

Teachers from across the College are asked to speak at prestigious local, national and international events about their subject specialism and the teaching methods they implement in their classroom.

Staff are dynamic in their approach to learning, keen to try new teaching methods and share good practice to find the best approach for their students. Teachers involve students in their learning so they leave here with the skills required to flourish in this ever-changing world. This goes beyond subject specific skills: we want our young people to be motivated, resilient, reflective, independent, and fully prepared for their next steps after college, whether it's higher or further education, training or employment.

SUPPORT **FOR YOU**

At Farnborough, every student matters: both in and out of the classroom, we take supporting you very seriously.

FROM SCHOOL TO COLLEGE

The transition from school to college can be daunting, but don't worry! There are several opportunities for prospective students to visit the College and familiarise themselves with life at Farnborough. Even during your first term at College, there are lots of events and in-class activities to make the step from school to college as easy as possible. COUNSELLING

STRETCH & CHALLENGE

Regardless of ability, all learners are actively encouraged to take advantage of opportunities which extend and deepen their subject expertise and, where appropriate, go beyond the limit of the subject specifications.

In lessons, teachers highlight which activities are designed to stretch and challenge students, so that those who feel able to can take on those tasks. Outside of the classroom, students are invited to attend talks and workshops, complete extension activities and conduct research to inspire their learning and challenge their thinking.

AIMING HIGH

For those students with ambitions to study at the most competitive universities, we offer many opportunities to help you achieve your goal. Our success speaks for itself: typically, around a quarter of our students who apply to Oxbridge receive an offer – significantly above the national average (20%).

The range of activities and support available to you include:

- Expert Tutor support throughout the UCAS process
- Preparation for applications and admissions tests
- Staff who specialise in specific subject applications
- Personal statement workshops and feedback
- 'Introduction to Oxbridge' talk from Admissions Tutors
- Interview guidance sessions and mock interviews
- Open Days, Oxbridge Conference and HE Convention visits

In 2018, the 'top-performing' A level institution in the country (according to The Telegraph, 15 April 2019) had a total A level cohort of 142 students who achieved 88.5% A* to A grades in their A levels. By comparison, in the same year, our top 195 A level students achieved all A* to A grades. This is not unusual for Farnborough; a similar pattern of success can be seen since the last century!

If you aspire to attend the world's very best universities, you can do no better than to study at The Sixth Form College Farnborough.

NEXT STEPS

ADVICE, CAREERS AND WORK SKILLS

Knowing and understanding all of the options for your next steps after College is immensely important. Whilst the vast majority of our students go on to HE, increasing numbers choose an apprenticeship or employment-based training following their studies – there are lots of options.

We have a professional, award-winning team, 'Prospects', who are here to help you make informed choices about your future. This team has been awarded the national Quality in Careers Standard, which recognises our commitment to provide impartial, independent careers education, information, advice and guidance.

CAREERS INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE

The first step to making decisions about what you will do after College is to gain a better understanding of the options available to you. Whilst the Tutorial and Prospects Diploma programmes address all of the options, students are encouraged to book a 1-to-1 appointment with one of our professional careers advisors.

We hold two major careers events at the College each year: the **Training**, **Employment and Apprenticeship Fair** and **Moving On Day**. Both provide extraordinary opportunities to speak directly to hundreds of universities, employers, training providers and global corporate businesses.

In order to broaden our students' knowledge base, whilst giving them a taste of university lectures, we have developed the **Farnborough Ideas Expo**; a series of masterclasses

delivered by university academics who are leading researchers in their fields.

Throughout the year, expert speakers from a wide variety of subject areas and industries are also invited into College to share information about the different progression pathways in their field.

ESSENTIAL WORKPLACE SKILLS

Whether you carry on in education or enter the world of work, it is highly likely that you will be asked about your essential workplace skills – skills such as resilience, effective communication and problem solving. The Prospects team has links to both local, national and international employers across a range of sectors and can help you identify relevant placement or volunteering possibilities. Having this experience really will give you the edge, and for some of our courses, work experience is a requirement.

THE PROSPECTS DIPLOMA

It is clear that employability skills are an essential part of the toolkit you will need whatever you choose to do in the future. At Farnborough, all students complete the **Prospects Diploma** which helps them to collate and evidence their own workplace experience and skills. In completing the Diploma, students build a 'professional profile' which they can use to put together a CV and take with them when they leave College.

The Diploma, which is compulsory, forms an essential part of the Tutorial programme and was designed in collaboration with employers, training providers and HE institutions to ensure that it meets the needs of future employers and education establishments. We have received positive feedback from our leavers, who felt they had made significant progress with their employability skills.

The College competes in football, rugby, netball, hockey, badminton, basketball and cricket at county, regional and national levels. There are also opportunities to represent the College in swimming and cross country.

Training is added to a student's timetable and teams are coached by experts to ensure each player has the opportunity to reach their full sporting potential. Students compete against top teams from across the country and achieve much success. We've even had former students who have gone on to compete at the Olympics!

Highlights from the last year include:

- Men's hockey team reaching the finals of the Association of Colleges' National Cup and the mixed hockey team made it to the semi-finals.
- 20 of our students representing in golf, badminton, cross country, tennis and basketball at the Association of Colleges' National Sports finals as part of the South East team. Every student medalled in their sport, with our women's basketball team winning overall!
- Men's football team getting to the semi-finals of the English Schools' Football Association U18 National Cup.
- Men's swimming team made it to the Relay National Finals in both freestyle and medley.

We also support the many students who compete at international level in a multitude of sports and help them to juggle demanding training schedules with their studies.

PROSPECT THEATRE COMPANY

This is the second year dedicated theatre company. The company visit local schools, take part in workshops, see shows and perform in the Prospect Theatre.

LAMDA SHORT COURSES

Undertake nationally recognised LAMDA qualifications in acting and musical theatre - students prepare audition speeches/songs for a visiting examiner.

PRODUCTION DRAMA/ MUSICAL THEATRE ENRICHMENT

These two unique groups come together for an annual Christmas production and continue through the year with smaller performances.

FLEXI-CREW

Become one of our magnificent technical team; if lighting, sound, stage management, set or costume design are your thing then this is the place to be!

MUSIC

Our music department is one of the most renowned and versatile in the country, providing outstanding musical tuition.

Many concerts are organised each year, from grand choral projects to intimate recitals. Students have performed in some of Europe's foremost venues, including Westminster Abbey, St. Paul's Cathedral, St. Mark's Basilica, Venice and the Nikolaikirche, Leipzig, and enjoy unparalleled industry experience, such as performing, recording and mixing at the world-famous Abbey Road Studios.

In addition, we offer opportunities to collaborate with world renowned artists, with past masterclasses and recitals being delivered by musicians such as Jess Gillam and Julian Lloyd Webber.

The department boasts world-class facilities including a purpose-built recording studio, 60 new iMac computers running Logic Pro X and NI Komplete 11, 2 mixing suites, a band performance room, a 300 seat theatre, a recital room, 4 grand pianos (including a Bösendorfer), 12 fully-equipped practice rooms, 3 bespoke contemporary music rehearsal spaces and 20 MacBook Pro computers.


