Courses can be withdrawn if recruitment numbers are not viable.

CHOOSING YOUR COURSES

Before choosing your courses, it is important to understand your options.

WHAT WE OFFER

At the College, we offer both A level and vocational courses at Level 3, which are equivalent to Key Stage 5.

In order to successfully manage the transition from Level 2 (GCSE level) courses to Level 3, we require students to demonstrate a minimum level of skill at Level 2. This should be represented by at least 5 grade 4's at GCSE level.

At Level 3, at this college, you may choose from different styles of assessment:

A levels

These general academic courses are mainly assessed through examination at the end of two years.

Vocational

These are qualifications that are equivalent to A levels but are more vocationally oriented. Assessment varies by course and combines coursework, supervised assessment and examination.

The majority of our students study three Level 3 courses in any combination over two years. A level and vocational courses are not mutually exclusive - they can be studied together. For example, you may choose to study two A level courses and a vocational course, or two vocational courses and one A level.

YOUR GCSE GRADES

Your GCSE grades will give a good indication of which courses are right for you.

Our entry requirements are set to give students a clear guide on the level of understanding, knowledge and skills they will need to achieve their best.

For the majority of A level courses, students will have mostly achieved grade 5s (or higher) across their GCSEs, though we can be flexible with this.

To access our vocational courses, students would generally achieve grade 4s or higher in their GCSEs – this includes a grade

4 (or higher) in GCSE English language.

Some subjects have additional specific entry requirements that can be found on the individual course pages via the College website.

We look at each student's GCSE results on an individual basis to ensure we guide them onto the most appropriate programme of study. Your Personal Tutor will give you advice on your course choices at interview and again at enrolment once you know your GCSE results.

STRETCH, CHALLENGE & BREAKING BARRIERS

Regardless of ability, all learners are actively encouraged to take advantage of opportunities which extend and deepen their subject expertise and, where appropriate, go beyond the limit of the subject specifications.

In lessons, teachers highlight which activities are designed to stretch and challenge students, so that those who feel able to can take on those tasks. Outside the classroom, students are invited to attend talks and workshops, complete extension activities and conduct research to inspire their learning and challenge their thinking.

ASPIRE PROGRAMME

All students with a strong GCSE profile will become a member of the 'Aspire' programme which will help you to prepare for competitive course applications including Oxbridge.

FURTHER MATHS

If you are planning on studying A level maths as part of your programme of study and are on track to achieve a grade 8 or 9 in GCSE maths, you may choose to add A level further maths as a fourth subject.

EXTENDED PROJECT QUALIFICATION (EPQ)

Stand out from the crowd - the EPQ is an independent research qualification, valued by universities and equivalent to half an A level. You start your EPQ in the summer term of your first year. You will be given more information about the EPQ closer to the time.

ALL ABOUT YOU

Remember, this is all about you! What are your ambitions? What are your strengths? What do you enjoy? What do you like learning about?

DO YOUR RESEARCH

YOUR JOURNEY

BY TRAIN

There are three stations within easy walking distance of the College: Farnborough Main, Farnborough North and Frimley. If you're getting the train to college, it only takes 15 minutes to walk from Farnborough Main and Farnborough North train stations, and it's just a 20 minute walk from Frimley train station.

BY FOOT

Many of our students live locally and therefore find it more convenient to walk to college - it's only a 25 minute walk from Farnborough town centre to the College!

BY BICYCLE

The College has secure cycling racks where you can store your bike. We ask students to research the safest cycle route in advance.

BY BUS

Bus services to college are provided by Stagecoach and Thames Valley Bus service. Bus routes and times are subject to change.

BY CAR

There is limited reserved parking on and around the College site - First Year students will be able to apply for a parking permit at the nearby football ground, in the summer term, subject to availability and on a first come first served basis. TEACHING

As an outstanding college, it is important to us that we have commited teachers who are passionate about improving students' achievements.

We take a dynamic approach to learning and are keen to try new teaching methods and share good practice to find the best approach for our students. Our staff are reflective professionals, always striving to improve students' understanding in lessons through guided practice (such as scaffolding, modelling and effective questioning) whilst creating opportunities for elaboration and discussion.

Staff contribute to academic journals and articles, and have published books relating to their fields of expertise. Many of our teaching staff are also examiners, meaning they are experts in exam technique. They also have a deeper understanding of the standards required for assessments, with many contributing to and writing exam board textbooks.

LEARNING TECHNOLOGIES

Technology is central to every student's learning journey at the College. Our goal is to equip learners with the skills they need for a successful and prosperous future in a digital and connected world. We focus on ensuring that our students understand online safety, cloud based working and digital creativity.

Subject resources are collated on the Study Directory for all courses, extra curricular and support needs. Assignments are set via Google Classroom, and we make extensive use of Gmail and Google Chat for communication between students and staff. Students have unlimited cloud based storage at their disposal, as well as access to Adobe Creative Cloud and other specialist software as required. Where students are asked to access specialist tools, for example in graphic design, media studies and music technology, workstations are installed in the classrooms.

Students are encouraged to bring their own tablet or laptop into college to work on if they have one.

OUR RESULTS

AN INSIGHT INTO CONSISTENTLY BRILLIANT RESULTS

The College is an outstanding choice for post-16 study by any measure. Our students flourish here and fulfil their potential, and they have done so for many years.

Last year our students achieved an astonishing pass rate of 99.5% at A level. Almost half of these were awarded at either A* or A and 90.2% of courses were graded A* to C.

Our vocational subjects have achieved an amazing pass rate of 99.5%. On top of this, an extraordinary 82% of students achieved high grades!

A STEPPING STONE

DEGREE CLASSIFICATION

FROM SCHOOL TO COLLEGE

This includes our Getting Ready and Induction events where you can meet other new students and take part in activities that will help you prepare for college. Even during your first term here, there are lots of events and in-class activities to make the step from school to college as easy as possible.

PERSONAL TUTORS

Our team of Personal Tutors are carefully selected to ensure that they are the right people to guide and support you at every step of your journey through college. Weekly tutorials will cover everything from investigating your future career options and HE applications, to developing vital life skills and looking after your health and wellbeing. Simply put, your Tutor is your rock during your time at Farnborough, listening, challenging and supporting you to achieve your very best.

HEALTH AND WELLBEING

We understand how important it is that our students have access to support for their physical and mental health. The College has nurses who can help with health issues, and our Health and Wellbeing Coordinator can give advice and guidance on medical, emotional and welfare needs.

We have a dedicated Wellbeing Centre where students can access counselling and coaching to support their mental and emotional health.

There are also a number of staff across the College who are specifically trained to support students with managing their mental health.

STUDY SUPPORT

Our dedicated Study Support team is committed to responding flexibly and effectively to students with special educational needs and EHCPs. We will work with you to identify individual learning needs and arrange appropriate support. We offer one to one support, small group support sessions and Learning Mentors, as well as specialist teacher and ELSA support. The department also has a sensory room, individual workstations and smaller classrooms where you can complete your work.

We understand that coming to college can be overwhelming for many students. The department hosts their own familiarisation sessions and arranges support meetings ahead of the College-wide induction events.

Throughout your time here, we will work closely with you, your Personal Tutor and teachers to ensure that you have all the tools to achieve your very best.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The College always seeks to prioritise financial assistance for eligible students as soon as they enrol at Farnborough. You may be entitled to receive financial support for transport, meals, and learning costs. The College may also be able to help with the purchase of textbooks, calculators and art resources. This support for your emotional and mental health is free and confidential. CAREERS ADVICE AND GUIDANCE

The landscape of training, employment, apprenticeships, and higher education has never been more exciting, with a wealth of opportunities to explore.

The College is committed to ensuring that every student is aware of their options regardless of any preconceptions. Our students leave Farnborough fully equipped to make competitive applications that reflect their hard work and effort. We want you to be ambitious and progress from the College confident that you will achieve brilliant things!

OUTSTANDING ADVICE

The Prospect Trust Careers Services team are here to help you make informed choices about your future. They hold the national "Quality in Careers Standard" Award, which recognises their commitment to provide students with impartial, independent careers, education, information, advice and guidance. The College fulfils all the Gatsby Benchmarks, a framework that defines what makes the best careers provision in schools and colleges.

CAREERS INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE

All students are encouraged to book a 1:1 appointment with one of our professional careers advisers to explore the opportunities available to them.

We also hold two major careers events at the College each year: the Training, Employment and Apprenticeship Fair and Moving On Day. These offer opportunities for students to speak directly to hundreds of universities, employers, training and apprenticeship providers and global businesses.

Throughout the year, expert speakers from academia and industry are also invited into college to share information about the different progression pathways in their field.

THE PROSPECTS DIPLOMA

It is clear that employability skills are an essential part of the toolkit you will need for whatever you choose to do in the future. At Farnborough, all students complete the Prospects Diploma over two years which helps them to collate and evidence their own workplace experience and skills. Students build a 'professional profile' which they can use to put together a CV and take with them when they leave college.

The Diploma, which is compulsory, forms an essential part of the Tutorial programme and was designed in collaboration with local employers, training providers and HE institutions to ensure that it meets the needs of future employers and education establishments.

WORK EXPERIENCE AND ESSENTIAL WORKPLACE SKILLS

Whether you carry on in education or enter the world of work, it is highly likely that you will be asked about your essential workplace skills – skills such as resilience, effective communication and problem solving. Our Propsect Trust Careers Service Work Experience team has links to local, national and international employers across a range of sectors, and can help you identify relevant placement and volunteering possibilities using the Grofar platform. All students are required to participate in a week's work experience placement whilst at the College – having this experience really will give you the edge, and is a key component of The Prospects Diploma.

Q DO YOU HAVE LARGE CLASS SIZES?

Our classes hold on average 20 students, ideal for study at this level.

Q IS FARNBOROUGH ONLY FOR 'ACADEMIC' STUDENTS?

We offer a wide range of courses, including vocational subjects. These are assessed through coursework, supervised assessment and exams and are valued for further study, HE, apprenticeships and employment!

Q HOW WILL I MANAGE MY WORKLOAD?

As part of your timetable, you will be assigned Study Periods which we encourage you to use to complete your work.
